Students pursuing a degree in Arts (BA), Commerce (BComm), Health Sciences (BHSc), and Science (BSc) are required to meet the University’s Breadth requirement, as set out below, as a condition of graduation\*. **Students from these programs are required to successfully complete one course (minimum 3 credit hours) from each of the four Quadrants below.** The courses are required to have a matching prefix from each quadrant.

This requirement applies to all students admitted or re-admitted to UNBC for studies beginning September 2010 Semester or later.
